Looking Within: REFLECT & SHARE

So far you have been doing a lot of investigative work. This is important.



Take the time to REFLECT on what you have read, discovered and learned.

What does all this mean to YOU?

Record your reflection in some form.

Learning takes on deeper meaning when it is shared. Taking the time to share your reflections with someone else allows you to experience someone else's perspective. Take the time to SHARE your reflections with someone else.

How were your responses similar? How were your responses different?

Take Action to research and find another reading or resource relating to indoor and outdoor air quality that you really like - a reading that connects with YOU.

Compile the complete reference information for the reading / resource. Write a single paragraph explanation of why you have selected the reading / resource and how it connects with you. To receive credit for this module, you will be required to submit your recommended related reading / resource component to your facilitator.

Share the reading / resource you have selected with someone else and discuss your collective responses. How were your responses similar? How were your responses different?

Take advantage of opportunities to engage in further dialogue with your co-learners and your facilitator about what you have been reading and discovering in the course to date.



Looking Forward: Consider possible ACTION



In considering possible action we are asking you to complete some important detective work. The first part of your detective work has to do with the indoor air quality and the second part has to do with outdoor air quality.

Learning Detective Work Part 1: Indoor Air Quality

Take action to find out more about the air in your home, work or learning environment. Find out more about how the air comes in, what happens to the air / how it is handled and where it goes. Find out what you can about the implications of our activities and the built environment on indoor air quality. You will be required to submit a reflection component on this activity.

Learning Detective Work Part 2: Outdoor Air Quality

This detective work will have you taking action to research air quality from different perspectives. You will compare a community close to where you live to another community in another country and find out what you can about air quality measures in the comparison areas. To make the comparison more relevant try to choose two communities with a similar connection such as climate, population, or geography.

What are you able to find out about air quality in each of these areas?

What sources of information are available?

What are the contributors to the air quality in each of these areas?

Think about these general activities and action avenues relating to air quality. You will be required to submit a reflection component on this activity.

• In addition to what you submit to your facilitator, you are also encouraged to participate in formal and informal dialogue opportunities with co-learners. Discuss the following question: How did this module impact YOU?
